



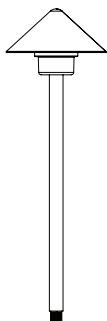

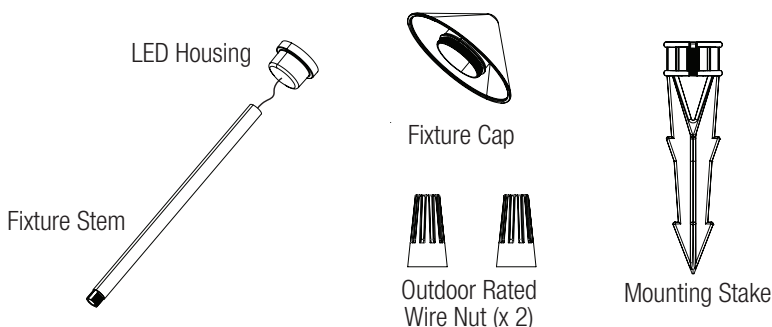

Before You Begin

IMPORTANT: To prolong the life of your product, do not energize fixtures in direct sunlight.

IMPORTANT: The Path light ships with an exposed LED. Inspect the light before installing and exercise caution when assembling the fixture. **Any damage to the LED is NOT eligible for warranty coverage.**

Plan Your Layout

Complete a layout plan to ensure a smooth installation process.

1. Sketch a dimensionally accurate layout of the installation location. Identify buildings and other large structures. If you already have a transformer installed, mark its location.
2. Mark where you plan to place each light fixture, noting groups where lights are close together. If you already have a transformer installed, be mindful of the fixture(s) distance from the transformer (see page 4).
3. Measure the distance between fixtures.
4. If you do not have a transformer installed, determine a transformer location that will minimize the length of main wire branch to prevent voltage drop.
5. Map out the wire connections between fixtures and to your transformer. Add up the total amount of wire you will need.



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Ensure the low voltage cable will:

- Be protected by routing in close proximity to the luminaire or fitting next to a building structure such as a house or deck.
- Not be buried more than 6 inches (15.2 cm).

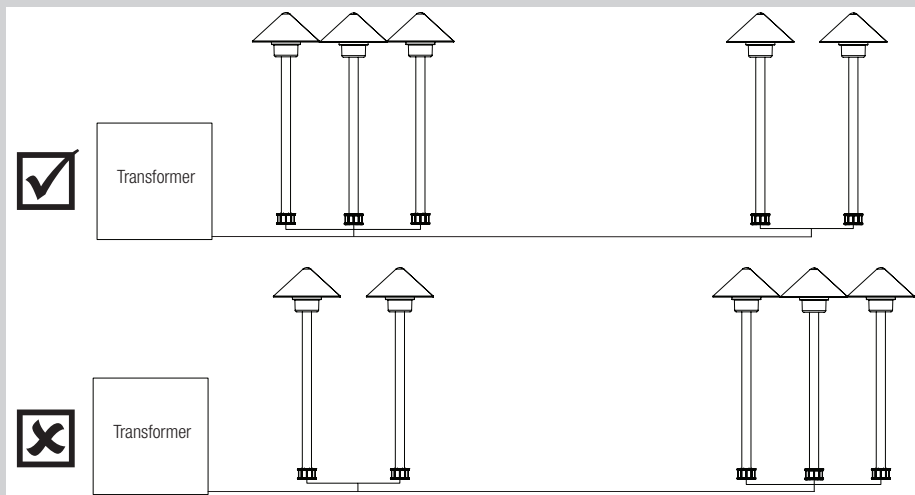
Determine Appropriate Wiring

Refer to the Wire Gauge tables on pages 5 and 6 to determine the appropriate cable gauge and transformer power based on the total number of fixtures and wire length.

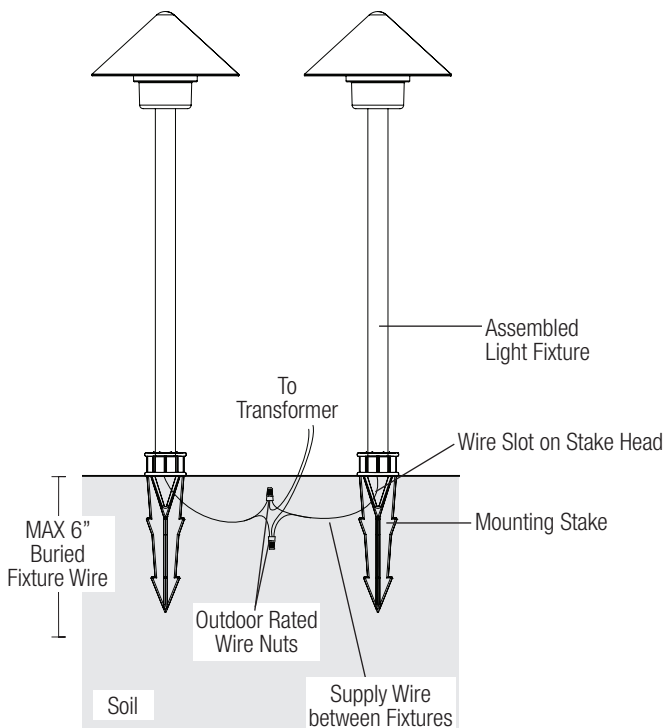

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Installation

Installation and Mounting Overview



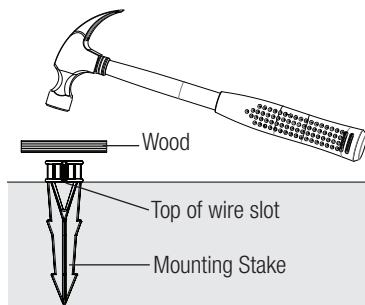
⚠ WARNING – Turn the main power **OFF** before proceeding. Connecting to live electricity may damage the light.

Mount the Stake

1. Position the stake in the ground.
2. Place a piece of wood on the stake. Hammer the wood until the top of the wire slot is flush with the ground.

If there's hard soil:

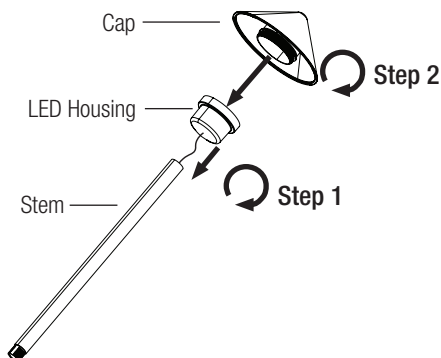
1. Dig a hole.
2. Place the stake so the top of the wire slot is flush with the ground.
3. Fill the hole and pack tight to secure the stake.



Assemble the Fixture

⚠ CAUTION – To prevent damage, assemble the fixture **BEFORE** installing into the mounting stake. When assembling, thread by hand and avoid cross threading.

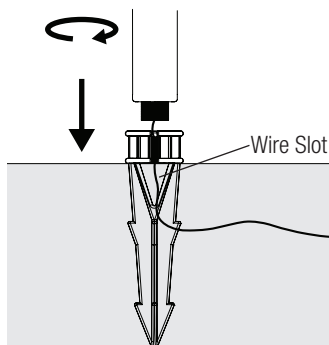
1. Thread the LED housing into the fixture stem by rotating clockwise until snug.
2. Thread the cap onto the LED housing by rotating clockwise until snug.



Install the Fixture

⚠ CAUTION – Be sure to maintain slack on the wires inside the fixture. Excess tension on the wiring could damage the light.

1. Screw the fixture onto the provided stake, leading the fixture wire through the wire slot in the stake.



2. Repeat for other fixtures in the same electrical circuit.
3. Turn the main power supply back on and ensure the fixtures illuminate.



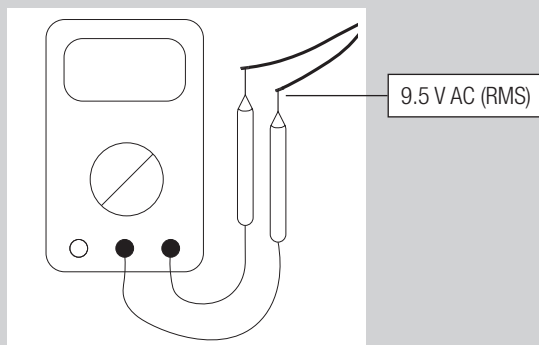
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Make Wire Connections

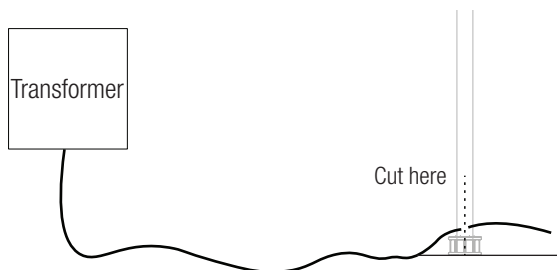
IMPORTANT: Test to ensure fixtures illuminate throughout the wiring process.

NOTES FOR INSTALLERS

- Measure for voltage drop at each light throughout installation and with all other lights operating.
- Use the appropriate tap on the transformer for optimal performance.
- Be aware of the cumulative voltage drop from the cumulative current of each light.



1. Cut the transformer supply wire at the fixture location.

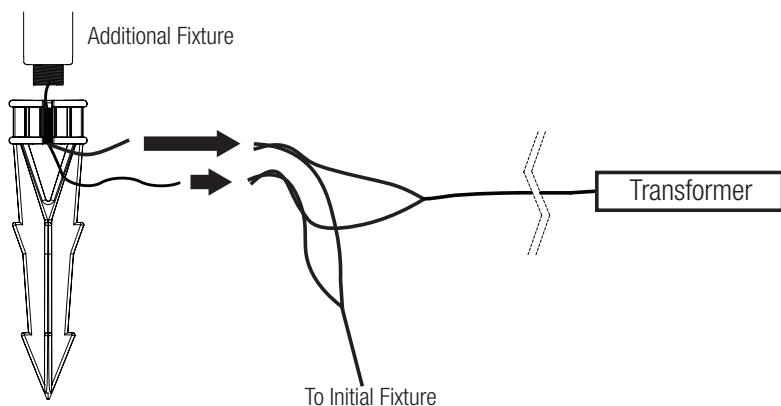


2. Separate the supply wire and strip $\frac{1}{2}$ " of insulating material.



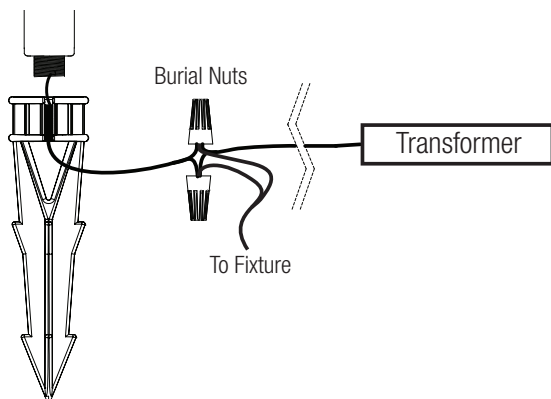


3. Connect the supply wire to the fixture wire by twisting the exposed copper strands.
4. If installing multiple fixtures, connect the wires of each additional fixture to the supply wire connection made in Step 3.



5. Secure the wire connections using the provided burial nuts.

IMPORTANT: If combining 18 AWG wires, do not exceed five wire connections in one burial nut.



6. Test to ensure the fixture illuminates. Repeat for each additional fixture.
7. Once you confirm that all connected fixtures illuminate at the appropriate voltage levels, bury the wire by digging a small trench.



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Operation

ColorLogic Landscape Path LED light fixtures are designed to operate in 5:1 MODE: Universal ColorLogic, Pentair®, Jandy®, ColorSplash, OmniDirect Mode.

Universal ColorLogic Mode

Use this mode for installations with Hayward ColorLogic lights. The ColorLogic lights will operate in the same manner as the connected ColorLogic Landscape Path light(s).

Pentair® Mode

Use this mode when installing your new light in systems with Pentair Intellibrite® lights. The Pentair lights will operate in the same manner as the connected ColorLogic Landscape Path light(s).

Jandy® Mode

Use this mode when installing your new light in systems with Jandy lights. The Jandy lights will operate in the same manner as the connected ColorLogic Landscape Path light(s).

ColorSplash Mode

Use this mode for installations with ColorSplash lights. The ColorSplash lights will operate in the same manner as the connected ColorLogic Landscape Path light(s).

OmniDirect Mode

OmniDirect mode offers unique colors as well as speed and brightness control. It must be configured and controlled by a Hayward OmniLogic, OmniHub or other Omni type pool controller. Refer to the controller's manual for more information.

To change modes

1. Turn on lights and then turn off for 11-15 seconds. Repeat this sequence two more times. The light should blink one of five colors to indicate which mode is activated. Refer to the table below to determine which mode is currently active. Note that **new lights default to Universal ColorLogic mode**.

OmniDirect	Magenta

2. To change modes again, turn light off and back on. The light will then advance to the next mode. Repeat this sequence until you arrive at the desired mode.
3. When the light is set to the desired mode, remove power from the lights for at least one minute. The light will restart in the new mode the next time you turn it on.

To reset to Universal ColorLogic mode

Turn lights on then turn off for 11-15 seconds. Repeat sequence three (3) additional times (for a total of four) to set to Universal ColorLogic mode. The light show software mode protocol shall override any previous mode to ensure the ability to reset the light to the default setting.



Universal ColorLogic Mode

ColorLogic Landscape lights default to Universal ColorLogic mode when powered for the first time. Light colors and shows are controlled through power-cycling: a method of changing light programs by turning the light off and on, removing the need for a special controller or interface. The number assigned to each light show and color represents the number of power-cycles necessary to activate it.

- To activate the light: Turn on the switch.
- To deactivate the light: Turn off the switch.
- To advance to the next light program (fixed color or color show): Turn off the switch and turn back on within 10 seconds. Repeat until you reach the desired light program.

When the light has been off for over 60 seconds, and is first turned on, it will illuminate white for 15 seconds, then proceed to the last running fixed color or color show.

NOTE: Do not power cycle the light during the first 15 seconds of white to prevent losing synchronization with other connected lights.

Light Synchronization

ColorLogic lights can synchronize with other Hayward Universal ColorLogic lights so they all display the same colors and shows at the same time. For light synchronization, all lights must be wired to the same switch. Once installed, all lights should automatically synchronize. To re-synchronize your lights, turn the switch on, then back off. Wait between 11 and 14 seconds and turn the switch back on. When the lights come back on, they should enter Program #1 (Voodoo Lounge) and be synchronized.

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Pentair Mode

Light colors and shows are controlled through power-cycling: a method of changing light programs by turning the light off and on, removing the need for a special controller or interface. The number assigned to each light program represents the number of power-cycles necessary to activate it.

- To activate the light: Turn on the switch.
- To deactivate the light: Turn off the switch.
- To select a light program (fixed color or color show): Turn the switch off and back on the number of times that corresponds to your desired show or color. Use the table below to determine how many power cycles are required for each light program.

NOTE: The number of power cycles is always the same for each program, even if another program is currently active. Always select a program using its corresponding number of cycles.

Light Synchronization

ColorLogic lights can synchronize with Pentair Intellibrite® lights so they all display the same colors and shows at the same time. For light synchronization, all lights must be wired to the same switch. Once installed, all lights should automatically synchronize.

Color Lock Feature (Program 13)

You can select a non-standard solid color at any time by activating the color lock feature. The color lock feature allows you to stop a light show and “lock” on any color during an active light show. To “lock” a solid color, power cycle the pool light switch off/on thirteen times when the desired color is displayed during the active light show.



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Return Feature (Program 14)

You can return to the last color locked color effect while in a light show mode or fixed solid colors by activating the return feature. To return to the last color locked color effect, power cycle fourteen times. After five seconds, the last saved color lock effect will be displayed.

When connected to a Pentair Controller: Select fixed colors and color shows using the controller. Refer to your control's manual to determine compatibility and for specific information about configuration and operation.

Jandy Mode

Light colors and shows are controlled through power-cycling: a method of changing light programs by turning the light off and on, removing the need for a special controller or interface. The number assigned to each light program represents the number of power-cycles necessary to activate it.

- To activate the light: Turn on the switch.
- To deactivate the light: Turn off the switch.
- To advance to the next light program (fixed color or color show): Turn off the switch and turn back on within 3 seconds. Repeat until you reach the desired light program.

If the light is off for 7 seconds or more, it will return to the most recently used color program when turned back on. This function allows you to keep your favorite color mode activated upon every start up.

Light Synchronization

ColorLogic lights can synchronize with Jandy lights so they all display the same colors and shows at the same time. For light synchronization, all lights must be wired to the same switch. Once installed, all lights should automatically synchronize. To re-synchronize your lights, turn the switch on, then back off, wait for 5 seconds and turn the switch back on. When the lights come back on, they should enter Program #1 (Alpine White) and be synchronized.

Color Lock Feature (Program 13)

You can select a non-standard solid color at anytime by activating the color lock feature. The color lock feature allows you to stop a light show and “lock” on any color during an active light show. To “lock” a solid color, power cycle the pool light switch off/on thirteen times when the desired color is displayed during the active light show.



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Return Feature (Program 14)

You can return to the last color locked color effect while in a light show mode or fixed solid colors by activating the return feature. To return to the last color locked color effect, power cycle fourteen times. After five seconds the last saved color lock effect will be displayed.

Memory Mode

When your light fixtures are turned off for longer than 10 seconds, the light show or solid color on display will be stored. The next time the power is turned on, the fixture will display that saved memory light show or color.

OmniDirect Mode

OmniDirect mode offers unique colors as well as speed and brightness control. To use OmniDirect mode, the ColorLogic lights must be configured and controlled by a supporting Hayward “Omni” pool control. Compatible pool controls include the Hayward OmniLogic, OmniHub and OmniPL. Refer to your control’s manual to determine compatibility and for specific information about configuration and operation.
